What Care to Expect

Wolverhampton Diabetes National Service Framework Local Implementation Team

The WDNSFLIT has the authority and responsibility to ensure effective management of all NHS diabetes services within Wolverhampton.

The Wolverhampton DNSFLIT is managerially responsible for all National Health Service diabetes services within the Wolverhampton PCT. Its objective are to ensure the delivery of whole systems, integrated, patient centred and effective diabetes care; to develop an effective diabetes network; to ensure all stakeholders are engaged in its activity and to ensure that services are developed and delivered to the highest standards as set out in the Diabetes National Service Framework.

It reports to the Trust Board of the Wolverhampton PCT. It is to be chaired by a Director of the Primary Care Trust, its membership will include a District Diabetes Clinical lead, Primary and Specialist Care Clinical leads and the chair of the Wolverhampton Local Diabetes Services Advisory Group as well as other officers. It will be supported by a managerial lead to ensure operational management of the diabetes service and network.

Its terms of reference are:

1. To review the current status of the Diabetes Service to Wolverhampton and the surrounding areas.
2. To compare the current status of services with the standards and timescales outlined in the National Service Framework for Diabetes.
3. To develop an action plan for implementation of the standards as outlined in the NSF.
4. To develop an Annual Action Plan to ensure the standards outlined in the NSF are met.
5. To advise on and have the authority to make decisions on management of and matters concerning NSF implementation in line with the governance arrangements in both Trusts.
6. To provide an Annual Report to the Trust Boards of the PCT and/or Wolverhampton Hospitals including proposals for annual development in order to meet NSF standards.
7. To provide a Communication Strategy to ensure that all stakeholders within the Community are aware of the National Service Framework for Diabetes participate in the implementation of changes required in order to meet the standards of the National Service Framework and monitor progress.
8. To provide a forum where users, carers and stakeholders have an opportunity to share their views in the shaping of future services for the City.
9. To aim for beacon site status ensuring that best practice and opportunities for service modernisation are embraced and are incorporated into service re-development.
